On the 24th of November two Abagold cycling teams sponsored by key suppliers to the company participated in the 20th Coronation Double Century Cycle Tour in Swellendam.

The route started at the show grounds, from where teams made their way to the N2 before reaching Suurbraak after 22 kilometers, from where they ascended the Tradouw Pass towards Barrydale. Fresh from the Tradouw Pass climb, a left-turn onto the R62 took them to the next challenge - the 7 km Op de Tradouw climb - before making their way to Montagu. Here they encountered head winds of up to 50km/h with pelting rain.

The route then snaked through Cogmanskloof towards Ashton and Robertson, taking cyclists onto the R317 and over Rooiburg towards Bonnievale Cellars, then towards Drew before linking up with the R60 to ride to the finish in Swellendam. The Coronation DC finished on top of Van Eeden Street in Swellendam, where they had to complete a final 1km climb - a full 204km with more than 2000 metres of vertical ascent.
